6th Annual Crawl 4 the Cure for MS

HTR 4x4 Club and Twin City Off Road proudly announce the 6th annual Crawl 4 the Cure on July 15-18, 2010. Crawl 4 the Cure is a weekend of off road vehicle trail riding to raise money for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, Minnesota Chapter.

For a reasonable donation participants are treated to a weekend of fun and camaraderie with like minded enthusiasts looking to help out a great cause. Drivers and their guests camp at for three nights, have two days of guided trail rides, eat a BBQ dinner cooked by event volunteers, enjoy a fully catered pig roast with all the fixings, receive raffle tickets for a chance to win awesome door prizes and more.

Trail riding takes place at the 1200 acre Iron Range Off Highway Vehicle Recreation Area (IROHVRA) in Gilbert, MN, the state's first public off-road park. The park features a clearly marked trail system with a variety of terrain for a broad range of vehicle and skill levels. Beginners will have fun exploring the capabilities of their stock 4x4's while seasoned veterans piloting custom rock buggies will find extreme rock crawls as tough as anything, anywhere in the in world. All makes and models of off highway vehicles are welcome but space is limited to the first one hundred registrants.

During the first five years, Crawl 4 The Cure has raised close to \$160,000 for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, Minnesota Chapter. In fact, it has been the largest independent fundraiser for that charity for the last several years. Crawl 4 The Cure organizers hope to raise \$40,000 at the 2010 event.

MS is an autoimmune disease that affects the central nervous system. Approximately 400,000 Americans acknowledge having MS, and every week about 200 people are diagnosed. Worldwide, MS may affect 2.5 million individuals.

Off road trail riding is a great opportunity to use a 4x4 vehicle for a fun and exciting hobby rather just a method of transportation. Families enjoy getting outdoors together and offroading is a great way to access remote sites, take in scenic views, relax on a leisurely ride down a winding trail, or push a vehicle to the limit.
